Stage 1: Read this article (below) to your partner.

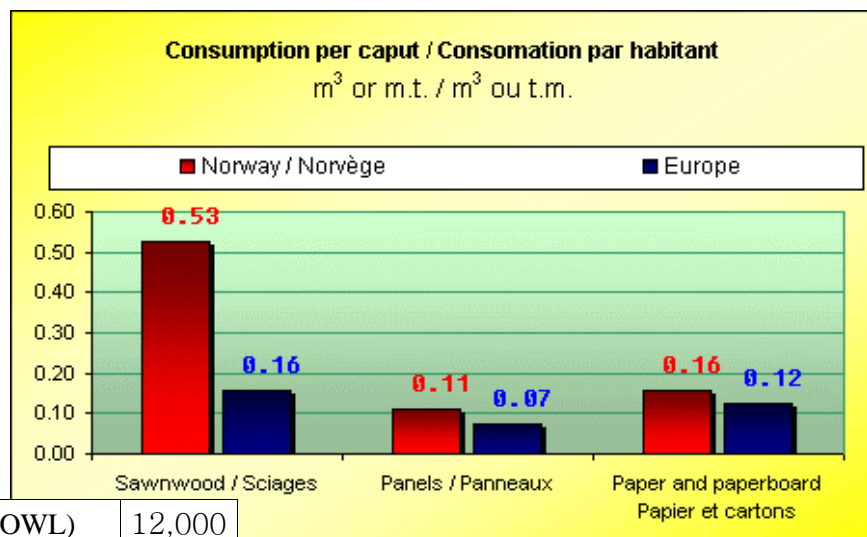

Each year Norway produces cubic metres (m³) of untreated wood (Wood in the rough), which is exported (.....), sold for fuel, or made into products such as sawnwood,, woodpulp, paper or paper board. The average figures for 1993 to 1995 show that Norway exported m³ of sawnwood, m³ of panels, Metric tonnes (m.t.) of woodpulp, m.t. of paper and paper board, and 135,000 m.t. of, each year. Norway imports fuelwood (8,000 m³) and other forestry products. Figures for 1993 – 1995 show that Norway imported m³ of wood in the rough, m³ of sawnwood, m³ of panels, m.t. of woodpulp, m.t. of paper and paper board, and m.t. of waste paper.
