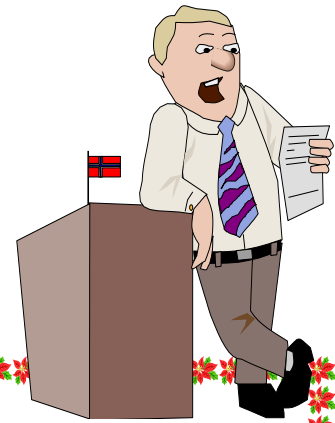


Note Cards

Korean Eating Etiquette.

When you are invited to a Korean home for a meal, the Host will come out and will show you inside. The host will introduce you to his family. If the family members are older than you or are female, it is best to bow. You can shake hands with members who are male and of the same age. As a visitor you will usually buy a gift for the family and the type of gift will depend on the reason for the meal. If the meal is for a member of the family (e.g. a birthday), you should buy a gift for that person. But if the meal is for you, then you can buy a gift for anyone in the family

When you are invited to a Korean restaurant, there are some table manners that non-Koreans need to know about.

- 1 When you go to a Korean restaurant, you do not have to wait. You can sit down wherever you want as long as those seats are not taken or reserved.
- 2 There is no strict rule on smoking in traditional Korean restaurants. You can usually smoke in a restaurant which serves wine. However, people do not usually smoke in restaurants where there is no wine.
- 3 You may talk to other people when you eat. However, you should not talk too much, especially if you do not know the other people very well.
- 4 You should not blow your nose in a restaurant. This is rude in Korea.
- 5 Tipping is not necessary, except in expensive restaurants or hotels.
- 6 When the meal arrives, you should not eat until a senior person starts. You should also not finish too early.
